	• (PS - Planning) AGA APPEAL as of 26/06 – Hearing took place on 25/06 and site visit 26/06. Now awaiting PINS decision letter, but with the 28/03/24 letter from PINS suggesting a decision date on or			
	before the 29 th August 2024.

Fletcher Methodist Chapel – Recently caught fire and the building has now been secured. Seven Terrace & the Beacon - planning applications on the horizon

- (JD Prosperity & Investment Director) Fiber is rolling out across the council area.
- (JBiel Culture) We are committed to a World Heritage festival programme again this year in September starting with the Coracle Regatta 28th Aug, Seven Art Exhibition 6th -15th Sep, IGMT Coalbrookdale Open Days 7th/8th, a Wharfage road closure day 14th Sep, and Ironbridge Dog show TBC. Will let you know more details before the 26th.
- We are also undertaking our Cultural Ambitions project, an Arts Council England funded consultation that's starts a conversation towards the development of a Culture Strategy for the Borough (Culture including Heritage) Marion Blockley, Mary Lewis (Coracle Trust & Heritage Craft Association) and Nick Booth IGMT all came to one of the three engagement sessions. The next step will be a culture mapping exercise followed by the launch of our Culture Club networking/action set group.
- (CW Neighbourhood & Enforcement) Dale End: had a new play park that design has been decided, Ash Tree removals, Awarded the Green Flag Award, new Interpretation scheme going forward, bathing status granted and the entrance is behind the MoG. Only one incident of pollution since the status has been secured.
- **(HB Transport & Hwys)** The Council successfully received funding from Office for Zero Emission Vehicles (OZEV) to install EV charge points in Council car parks. We are currently working on proposals to install EV charge points in three of the car parks in Ironbridge Dale End, The Wharfage and Station Yard. The proposal is

• (Cllr CH) Telford & Wrekin Council new Destination Management Plan that will dovetail with the WHS Management Plan. Planning issues are a key issue for the WHS which include the AGA site and Power Station as well as incremental resident development. Planning Surgeries were introduced to combat the tension between residents, developers and the Local Authority.

Flood Funding has been secured for the area £1.2 million for about 40 properties that includes businesses, residential and flood walls. Details are still being refined.

Severn Gorge Countryside Trust

• (JB) Financial means is the biggest driver at the moment and fundraising is their major focus as well as independent contracting.

Ironbridge Gorge Museum Trust

- **(RH)** visitor numbers for summer is the key driver for funding. Visitor on target but revenue is not. Annual passes have changed to rolling debit with has helped, but they are still nowhere near prepandemic levels.
- Two Funding sources: 1. NHMF (National Heritage Monetary Fund) 2023-2026. Museum of the Gorge (MoG) is completed. About £1 million needed to turn it into the World Heritage Centre. Several buildings have been completed at Blists Hill. The Tollhouse is next to be tackled and with the Coalbrookdale site being at the end of the year. Jackfield and Coalport will take place following Coalbrookdale. 2. ACE (Arts Council England) with this funding a new fence is being erected around Blists Hill, the Hay Incline Plane will be addressed, the foundry is undergoing work as well as looking to reduce carbon & energy output.
- Other works that are needed but have no funding to be achieved: A sink hole needs investigation, Coalport has a wall falling, the Arboretum has two walls down, and Coalbrookdale has a wall that needs addressing.
- IGMT are having careful conversations around the environmental changes and the WHS at the moment.
- They will be introducing EV charging points soon
- Working towards a case study to use the mine water as an energy source with the Coal Authority and TWC.

- HJ is relocating to Denmark and will no longer be employed at the University of Birmingham from the end of September, but she will retain an affiliation as honorary research fellow at the university and she is happy to remain engaged in the steering group remotely.
